Mentored by renowned braiders, her career has been shaped by expert guidance and a deep-rooted love for hairstyling that traces back to her teenage years. With mannequin heads as her first canvas, Deborah's early fascination with hair has woven itself into a vibrant career, making her a respected and influential figure in the world of braiding.

Jocelyn Bioh (Playwright) is an award winning Ghanaian-American writer/performer from New York City. Her written works for theatre include: Merry Wives (Public Theater/ Shakespeare in the Park, PBS Great Performances), Nollywood Dreams (MCC Theater), and the multi award winning School Girls; Or, The African Mean Girls Play which was originally produced at MCC Theater in 2017/2018 and has gone on to have over 50 regional productions. Her Broadway playwriting debut came in the fall of 2023 with Jaja's African Hair Braiding. The comedy, produced by Manhattan Theatre Club at the Samuel J. Friedman Theatre in New York City, was directed by Whitney White. The play was selected as a New York Times Critic's Pick, received two extensions and had its final week of performances streamed live worldwide. It was nominated for six Tony Awards in 2026 including Best Play and Best Direction of a Play. It was also nominated for Outstanding Play at the 2024 Drama Desk Awards.

Jocelyn has also written for TV on "Russian Doll", Spike Lee's "She's Gotta Have It", the Hulu series "Tiny Beautiful Things" and is also writing the live screen adaptation of the hit Broadway musical Once On This Island for Disney+. She was 2023's recipient of the Outstanding Adaptation Drama Desk Award.

Playwright's Note

For most of my life, truly since I was four years old, I have been wearing my hair in braids. I have had braids for so long, I can actually name the three times in my life when I did NOT have braids or some type of extensions for a significant amount of time. So I have spent a very large portion of my life in hair braiding shops and can tell you all about them. The stuffy ones that have way too many braiders in too small of a room. The shop that only has one hair braider because she likes her peace of mind. The shop that is located behind another place of business (a barber shop, a bodega, a pharmacy, a fish market, I've seen it all). I've gone to 125th Street and taken my chance with the kind hair braiding lady standing on the corner, flagging down any customer she could find; always with the standard sales pitch: "Hair braiding miss?" I'm always arrested by the relief on their faces when someone responds, "Yes, I'd like to get my hair braided." I imagine that at least for the next few hours, their dignity is restored. This play is for each and every person who enters the shop. Their hopes. Their dreams. Their incredible stories of how and why they came to this country. I celebrate these amazing women and thank them for what they do. To many people, they are just "hair braiding ladies;" random women people pass by on the street, but to me, they are heroes, craftswomen, and artists with beautiful, gifted, and skilled hands.

WHAT WE DO

CRRA provides resettlement services to refugees and asylees who are escaping violence, persecution, and repression.

At CRRA we embrace refugees who arrive in Charlotte, recognizing their troubling experiences, trying to ease their transition into a new country, and respecting their need to remember where they came from.

CRRA's infrastructure allows us to settle refugees of all nationalities and religions. Refugees are arriving from Myanmar, Congo, Ethiopia, Afghanistan, Syria, and Central America – as well as others.

The agency, working through HIAS and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, provides basic services for refugees during their initial 90 day period of resettlement.

- CRRA obtains and furnishes apartments and stocks them with food so that once the caseworker meets the newly arriving refugee, they have a home
- New arrivals receive help registering their children for school, enrolling in benefits, obtaining Social Security cards and are able to attend classes for English as a Second Language (ESL)
- Our employment counselors endeavor to find them work and guide each arrival toward self-sufficiency
- Additional grants provide extended medical case management, employment services, financial literacy, a savings program and cultural orientation classes.
- CRRA also connects refugees and asylees to other service agencies in the area

- Volunteers play an active role in helping Carolina Refugee Resettlement Agency's small, dedicated staff members work with newly arriving refugees
- CRRA accepts donations of select furniture and household items to help furnish the new homes for arriving refugees



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
