

THREE YEARS OF STRENGTH, LOVE, AND COMMUNITY: NICO'S JOURNEY

Nico is turning three in March, and his journey has been extraordinary. He has undergone seven surgeries—including heart surgery, cleft palate repair, and a G-tube placement—and has attended over 250 medical appointments. Most of his specialists are in Charlotte, 2.5 hours from home, and we've spent countless nights at the Ronald McDonald House, our dear home away from home. Since he was four months old, he has received in-home therapy multiple times per week, working with his physical, feeding, speech, and occupational therapists.



When Nico was born, he spent a month in the NICU at Levine Children's Hospital, where doctors checked him from head to toe. He had feeding difficulties and physical anomalies but was doing well enough to come home. A few weeks later, at a routine cardiology visit, we learned he indeed needed heart surgery, and we returned to Levine. The first year was a blur of hospital stays, medical appointments, and navigating healthcare and insurance. We secured resources, including a night nurse to help manage his G-tube and aspiration risks, giving us some rest and stability as new parents.








THREE YEARS OF STRENGTH, LOVE, AND COMMUNITY: NICO'S JOURNEY CONT.

At 7.5 months old, genetic testing finally gave us answers—Nico was diagnosed with Kabuki Syndrome, a rare genetic disorder affecting 1 in 32,000 babies. With this diagnosis came grief, gratitude, and a community—families worldwide who share similar challenges and victories. We also found a Kabuki Syndrome specialist, a neurogeneticist at Johns Hopkins Hospital, who now advises Nico's care remotely and sees him annually.



This Spring, Nico will also take on a new role—big brother! He is the light of our lives, and there is no one I admire more. His resilience, joy, and open-hearted love inspire us daily. Other people also seem very drawn to his laughter and engaging enthusiasm.

Being a SEND (Special Education Needs and Disability) mom has changed how I see the world. I advocate differently, relate to others differently, and find beauty in every "inchstone" to milestone. This journey has been challenging, but it is ours, and I wouldn't trade it for another.

We are deeply grateful for our family, friends, and the Kabuki Syndrome community, and shared love, celebration, and belief in Nico's incredible future.
